As coordinator of Link4Skills and several other projects, Kozminski University is driving groundbreaking research.

### **Key Current and Recent Projects**

- 1. Link4Skills (<u>www.link4skills.eu</u>): A Horizon Europe project focusing on fair skill utilization and exchanges across four continents, linking reskilling, automation, migration, and wage increases.
- 2. My Migration (<u>www.mymigration.academy</u>): A complex research project employing both Big Data (X and LinkedIn), Wide Data (My Migration) and Small Data (IDIs with Ukrainian female war migrants and returnees to Ukraine) to understand migration patterns and their socio-economic impacts.
- 3. Warsaw Talent Cluster: An initiative aimed at fostering local talent and connecting them with global opportunities in collaboration with Warsaw Municipality
- 4. MIMY (H2020): A project under Horizon 2020, focusing on the integration of young migrants across Europe.

### Twinned Research in Migration Skill Corridors in Link4Skills

KU and CRASH are embarking on exciting, twinned research in migration skill corridors:

- Developed Corridor: In collaboration with the Ukrainian Catholic University in Ukraine
- Emerging Corridors: Partnering with the <u>Scalabrini Migration Center, Inc.</u> in the Philippines and the <u>The International Institute of Migration and Development</u> in India focusing on emerging migration corridors for Poland

Together with <u>Erasmus University Rotterdam</u>, KU and CRASH is conducting a comprehensive survey with skilled migrants. This research aims to provide valuable insights into the dynamics of skill migration and its impact on both origin and destination countries.

Together with PJATK and ITTI, KU and CRASH are working on the Link4Skills Navigator (AI-Assisted Decision-Making dashboard).
